The Department once again had a busy fall semester beginning with the 30th Annual Game Ball Run. An added bonus this year was the attendance of the Commanding General of Cadet Command, MG Christopher Hughes (who grew up in Red Oak, IA) and his wife, at the game ball handoff in Tama.

DID YOU KNOW— COL Morton C. Mumma served as the Professor of Military Science and Tactics at the University of Iowa on 4 separate occasions. COL Mumma graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1900 and was commissioned as a 2LT of Cavalry. He served in Cuba, the Philippine Islands and Fort Des Moines prior to becoming the commandant of the cadet battalion in August 1909.

Because COL Mumma was considered a small arms expert he organized and commanded a Small Arms Firing School which was eventually consolidated with the Infantry School.

COL Mumma became the director of the effort to raise funds to build the Iowa Memorial Union

(IMU). COL Mumma also was active in the lowa City community where he was active in the Rotary Club, the Chamber of Commerce and the State Historical Society.

COL Mumma retired from active service in 1928 and joined his West Point classmate, General Robert Wood in business at the Sears, Roebuck and Company.

All three of COL Mumma's sons graduated from the US Naval Academy, one of which was awarded the Navy Cross during World War II.

COL Mumma died on May 30, 1945 and is buried at West Point. Picture from the 1928 Hawkeye Yearbook, p. 198.
