# HOME BASE OWNER HOME BASE

If you are transitioning from the military or a veteran looking for a new job consider coming back to lowa. The Home Base lowa initiative was put forward by former Governor Terry Branstad and Major General Tim Orr, the Adjutant General of the lowa National Guard. With the downsizing of the military, Gov. Branstad and MG Orr recognized an opportunity to recruit veterans and transitioning service members to help them find private-sector careers in lowa.

In 2014, the Iowa Legislature overwhelmingly passed the Home Base Iowa Act (HBI Act). This act provides the following incentives:

Military Pension Income Tax Exemption: The HBI Act fully exempts military pensions from state income tax.

Permissive Veterans Preference: The State of lowa and its subdivisions provide veterans preferential treatment in hiring decision. The HBI Act clarifies that it is legal for private businesses to do so as well.

Military Home Ownership Assistance Program: This one time use grant program offers up to \$5,000.00 to eligible veterans through the lowa Finance Authority program for the down payment or closing costs of a

erans, their spouses and their dependents. The State Board of Education is working toward shaping policy for awarding educational credit for skills and training obtained through military service.

Occupational Licensure: The HBI Act directs each of lowa's occupational licensing boards to adopt rules allowing credit for military training and experience in the licensing process. Further, each board must outline how those licensure restrictions may be eased for spouses of military members and veterans.

License Plates: Eligible applicants will be issued veterans related license plates (i.e. Purple Heart, Bronze Star, etc) at no charge. Veterans will continue to pay applicable vehicle registration fees.


